


GCCA's COVID-19 Response

OSHA Alliance Evolution

- Alliance began in 2010.
- Renewed twice (signing ceremony at last year's policy forum).
- In March, OSHA announced new Alliance Ambassador designation to recognize longstanding partnerships.
- GCCA Alliance in final stages of evolution to Ambassador status.
- Announcement expected in early August.



USDA-FSIS: Improving the Export Certificate Process

- Series of industry roundtables with FSIS leadership
- Highlighted challenges and opportunities to improve process
- Resulted in FSIS clarifying the ability for facilities to develop written programs related to reinspection
- Written programs can designate the percentage of product required to be staged for resinspection/verification
 - 10% given as an example

VIRTUAL MEETING

28-29 JULY 2020

- Courts directed CSB to complete rulemaking establishing a new chemical release reporting requirement
- Went into effect this spring first year focused on education (not enforcement)
- Rule includes a process for facilities already reporting to the National Response Center (NRC) – Most likely scenario for our industry
 - Must supply NRC identification number to CSB within 30 minutes of reporting to NRC
 - Reports may be made by email to: report@csb.gov, or by telephone at 202-261-7600
- GCCA working with IIAR, ASTI and others to communicate concerns to CSB about redundancy and burden of new process


We are the public health agency in the USDA that's responsible for ensuring that meat, poultry, and processed egg products are safe, wholesome, and accurately labeled.

Our Authority

Through a series of Acts, Congress empowers FSIS to inspect all meat, poultry, and processed egg products in interstate commerce.

- Federal Meat Inspection Act (FMIA), 1906
- Agricultural Marketing Act (AMA), 1946
- Poultry Products Inspection Act (PPIA), 1957
- Humane Methods of Slaughter Act (HMSA), 1958
- Egg Products Inspection Act (EPIA), 1970

Public Health Information System

PHIS is a dynamic, comprehensive data analytic system that contains data from inspection activities collected by FSIS employees


- PHIS Domestic was initially deployed in 2011
- PHIS Imports was deployed in 2012
- PHIS Exports was implemented on June 29, 2018
- Countries were added to PHIS Exports in Phases:
 - Phase 1: Afghanistan, Andorra, Bahamas, Bolivia, Burundi, Cape Verde, Cook Islands, Ethiopia, French Guiana, Gambia, Guinea, Liberia, Mozambique, San Marino, Tanzania, Uganda (June 2018)
 - Phase 2: Angola, Antarctica, Aruba, Bhutan, Botswana, Bouvett Island, Brunei Darussalam, Christmas Island, Comoros, Eritrea, Falkland Islands, Faroe Islands, French Southern and Antarctic Islands, Greenland, Guernsey, Heard Island and McDonald Islands, Isle of Man, Jersey, Lesotho, Liechtenstein, and Vietnam (May 2019)
 - Phase 3: China (January 2020)

PHIS Export Updates


Export changes, effective August 24, 2020

- Management and access functions: expanded access for corporate administrator.
- **Export application**: country letterhead statements; additional editable fields up to the final approver; spell check; exporter history tab.
- **UI and XML schema consistency**: data fields required through the UI will also be available to enter in the M2M XML schema.












Exporter page – allows edits




Product Details - Product Name allows edits






Statements and Add Statement Data button




Statements - Custom placeholders




Submit page – allows edits

Replacement Certificates

- FSIS has observed a trend of multiple replacement certificates issued for a single original due to typographical errors (transposed numbers, misspelled names, inconsistencies across documents, etc.)
- Excessive numbers of replacement certificates strain industry and agency resources, delay business transactions, and compromise the integrity of the certification process.
- There are currently over 5,000 replacement certificates in PHIS.

Replacement Certificates

- It is important to review the Export Library for every shipment. Using templates may not account for recent changes in requirements, including unapproved/delisted facilities.
- Information should be correct and consistent across all required documents. It is important to remember that some fields in PHIS are not editable.
- Product should not ship prior to completion of the certification process.
 This is consistent with regulatory requirements and is a specified requirement of some importing countries.

Replacement Certificates

Issuance of a replacement certificate is limited to five specific conditions:

- Original certificate did not contain required information
- Original certificate contained incorrect information
- Importer, exporter, or consignee changed
- Original certificate was lost or damaged
- Country of destination has changed

Lost Certificates

- Replacements for lost certificates can only be issued if there are no changes to the information included on the original.
- Replacements for lost certificates should not be requested for certificates known to be in transit. Every effort should be made to locate and return lost certificates to FSIS.
- These policies protect the integrity of the certification process.

- FSIS Inspection Program Personnel are <u>not</u> to issue letters or communications of any kind to address requests for additional information made by the importer or importing country. Please do not make this request of IPP.

Veterinary Signatures

- FSIS field personnel work diligently to provide timely certification of exports.
- Barring unforeseen circumstances, it is generally expected that FSIS PHVs will review and sign (or reject if necessary) export documentation requiring veterinary signature within 24 hours of receipt.
- A review of PHIS data shows our PHVs are largely meeting this goal.
 Most delays in obtaining a PHV signature are due to time needed to correct errors or obtain required seal and container numbers.

Veterinary Signatures

- If you are experiencing delays in the timely certification of exports and cannot resolve them at the local level, please work through the chain of command, starting with the Frontline Supervisor (FLS) and escalating to the District Manager.
- These personnel are best positioned to work directly with the warehouses to find solutions and reallocate resources if necessary.
 District Management has a vested interest in providing effective, efficient service.
