

## Work with Government Agencies

- Inclusion of Food Supply listed as part of Critical Infrastructure in <u>The President's Coronavirus Guidelines for America - 15</u> <u>Days to Slow the Spread</u>
- Four key areas that GCCA is communicating to government agencies.
  - Deem warehouse facilities "critical infrastructure"
  - Warehouse facilities should have priority access to COVID-19 testing
  - Warehouse facilities should have priority access to cleaning supplies
  - FMCSA hours of exemption should include transport from production facility to warehouse facility



# Relief Legislation – Sick and Paid Leave

- President signed second relief bill on March 18<sup>th</sup>
- GCCA worked with coalition partners to make provisions more workable
- Paid leave provisions apply to companies with fewer than 500 employees
- Companies with fewer than 50 employees will be allowed to opt out of the provisions if they would jeopardize business viability.
- Employees would get two weeks of sick leave
- Sick leave is to be paid at the usual pay rate capped at \$511 per day
- Employers initially pay for the sick leave but are fully reimbursed by the federal government within three months through refundable tax credits that count against employers' payroll tax

## Relief Legislation – Sick and Paid Leave

- The bill entitles employees parents taking care of children due to closed schools and day cares up to 10 weeks of paid leave.
- First 14 days of leave may be unpaid, then employees will be paid based on their normally scheduled hours and can be paid no less than two-thirds of their regular pay rate (capped at \$200 per day)
- Employees may claim paid leave for any of the following reasons related to the coronavirus public-health emergency:
  - They have been exposed to the coronavirus or exhibit symptoms of it.
  - They are recommended to quarantine by a healthcare provider and cannot work from home.
  - They need to care for a family member who has been exposed to or exhibits symptoms of the coronavirus.
  - They need to care for a child younger than 18 years old because their school or day care is closed, or their childcare provider is unavailable.
- Policy is in effect through the end of the year.




